The launch of TAP+ reflects the Puckett Center's ongoing commitment to workforce development, career readiness, and community empowerment across the Chattahoochee Valley.

"Every transition presents an opportunity," said Kate Vogel, Director of the Puckett Center. "Whether someone is leaving military service, changing careers, reentering the workforce, or simply searching for a new direction, TAP+ provides the structure, guidance, and community support to help them move forward with confidence. Our goal is to help people discover not just their next job, but a career path that aligns with their strengths, interests, and purpose."

Participants in the inaugural cohort are embarking on a guided journey through four developmental phases:

- **Discover** – Explore personal strengths, interests, and values.
- **Align** – Connect talents with education and high-demand career opportunities.
- **Connect** – Build relationships with employers, mentors, community resources, and professional networks.
- **Launch** – Create a personalized action plan for long-term career success.

More than a traditional career exploration course, TAP+ combines career assessment, workforce coaching, networking opportunities, and action planning into a comprehensive experience that equips participants with practical tools to pursue education, training, employment, or career advancement.

"The launch of TAP+ is an important step in expanding how we support individuals during pivotal moments in their lives," Vogel said. "By helping participants better understand their strengths and opportunities, we're building stronger pathways to meaningful employment and long-term success."
